

TOWNSHIP OF TINICUM, DELAWARE COUNTY, PA

ORDINANCE NO. 2019-907

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF TINICUM, DELAWARE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, VACATING, AMENDING AND/OR SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 360 VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC, ARTICLE II – ERECTION OF TRAFFIC CONTROLS; ARTICLE III – PARKING; ARTICLE VII – PARKING VIOLATION FINES; ARTICLE VIII – RESTRICTED PARKING; PROVIDING FOR RESIDENTIAL PERMIT PARKING WITHIN TINICUM TOWNSHIP WITH PERMITS NOT TO EXCEED FOUR (4) PER FAMILY OR HOUSEHOLD; ESTABLISHING PERMIT REQUIREMENTS AND FEES; ESTABLISHING PARKING REGULATIONS AND EXCEPTIONS; PROVIDING FOR ERECTION OF SIGNS NECESSARY TO CARRY INTO EFFECT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE; AND PROVIDING FOR FEES AND PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the TOWNSHIP OF TINICUM, County of Delaware, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, as follows:

**ARTICLE II
Erection of Traffic Controls**

§360-12. Violations and Penalties.

Any person violating any provision of this Article shall, upon summary conviction before a Magisterial District Judge, be subject to the imposition of a fine of Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars and the cost of prosecution and/or shall undergo imprisonment for a term not to exceed ten (10) days.

**ARTICLE III
Parking**

§360-16. Time limit parking.

From and after the passage of this Article, it shall be unlawful for any vehicle to park between the hours specified, for longer than the time indicated:

Name of Street	Side	Time Limit; Hours/Days	Location
Powhattan Avenue	Both	1 hour parking from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday	Between Wanamaker Avenue and Jansen Avenue

- A. Said hours shall refer to standard time, except in the period when daylight saving time shall be observed and, in the latter case, said hours shall refer to daylight saving time.

§360-17. Parking prohibited certain hours.

From and after the passage of this article §360-17 shall be vacated and of no effect.

§360-18. Diagonal parking only.

No person shall park a vehicle upon any of the streets or parts thereof described in this section, except in the designated diagonal direction from the curb line.

§360-19. Parking, stopping and standing prohibited at all times.

- A. No person shall park, stand or stop any motor vehicle, attended or unattended, at any time, upon any of the streets or parts thereof described in this section:

Name of Street	Side	Location
Governor Printz Boulevard	Both	From 5 th Street to Bartram Avenue
Saude Avenue	Both	From a point 25 feet south of Seneca Street to a point 25 feet north of Seneca Street.
Wanamaker Avenue		Entire length from Route 291. to Fourth Street

B. Parking, stopping and standing of Ridesharing vehicles.

From and after passage of this Article, it shall be unlawful for any vehicle utilizing ride sharing smart phone technology for transportation services to park, stand or stop on any street, highway or roadway within the Township of Tinicum except for the temporary pickup and delivery of passengers.

§360-20. Residential Permit Parking Only.

From and after the passage of this Article it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to park or cause to park any motor vehicle, at any time within the locations described below, without a current Residential Parking Permit issued by the Township of Tinicum as provided hereunder.

A. Restricted Residential Parking by Permit Between the Hours of 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. ONLY

Except as specifically provided otherwise in this Ordinance, from and after passage of this Ordinance, it shall be unlawful for any person, firm, corporation or other entity to park or cause to park any motor vehicle on any street or highway within Tinicum Township between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. without a Residential Parking Permit issued by the Township as provided hereafter.

Motor vehicles permitted to park under the terms of this Ordinance must bear current tags and a current inspection sticker issued by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Residents may apply to the Tinicum Township Police Department for an Annual Residential Parking Permit at the cost of One Dollar (\$1.00) per vehicle. For each permit, and renewal thereof, the applicant/resident shall provide a valid Pennsylvania Driver's License, year and type of vehicle owned or operated by the applicant/resident, together with registration thereof, and a computer generated utility bill showing the name and address of the applicant/resident as proof of residency

The Tinicum Township Police Department shall issue to the applicant/resident a sticker to be affixed to the specified vehicle. No more than four (4) Permits may be issued to any one property resident or household. Special Permits for resident's guest(s) may be issued for a limited time at the discretion of the Tinicum Township Police Department. Each vehicle permit shall be renewable annually before its expiration upon making application for renewal and payment of the renewal fee of One Dollar (\$1.00) per vehicle.

The privileges accorded under this Ordinance shall cease if the applicant/resident is no longer a resident of Tinicum Township; or if any vehicle does not have a current license tag or current inspection sticker issued by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

§360-21. Violations and penalties.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this article shall, upon summary conviction before a Magisterial District Judge, be subject to the imposition of a fine of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00), and the costs of prosecution, and/or shall undergo imprisonment for a term not to exceed ten (10) days.

ARTICLE VII **Parking Violation Fines**

From and after passage of this Ordinance, Article VII Parking Violation Fines and subsections 360-34 through 360-39 contained therein shall be vacated and be of no effect.

ARTICLE VIII **Restricted Parking**

§360-41. Parking restricted on certain streets.

- A. The parking of motor vehicles shall be and is hereby prohibited at all times upon the following streets, or portions thereof, except for motor vehicles owned or

operated by the owner of the abutting premises; or owned or operated by a member of their family; or by a lessee of said premises; or a member of their family; or by a business or social visitor of said owner or lessee or member of their family.

Saude Avenue rear alley	Both	From Delaware Street to Industrial Highway

§360-43. Violations and penalties.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this article shall, upon summary conviction before a Magisterial District Judge, be subject to the imposition of a fine of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00), and the costs of prosecution, and/or shall undergo imprisonment for a term not to exceed ten (10) days.

§ Severability.

If any sentence, clause, section, or part of this Ordinance is for any reason found to be unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid such unconstitutionality, illegality or invalidity shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses, sections or parts of this ordinance. It is hereby declared as the intent of the Board of Commissioners that this Ordinance would have been adopted had the unconstitutional, illegal or invalid sentence, clause, section, or part thereof, not been included therein.

§ Repealer.


All Ordinances or part of Ordinances which are insistent herewith are hereby repealed and/or replaced.
